The Forest Fragmentation and Land Use Change on-line continuing education course is designed for an audience seeking to broaden their knowledge and gain a basic background in land use and forest fragmentation issues.

The course is geared toward foresters, natural resource professionals, extension professionals, and planning professionals who want to learn more about forest fragmentation, land use change, land use change modeling, forest metrics, and planning issues associated with land use change.

This course was designed to provide an introduction to:

- Forest fragmentation and land use change
- Causes of fragmentation and land use change
- Methods of measuring land use change
- Methods of measuring forest fragmentation
- Impacts on wildlife resulting from land use change
- Impacts of forestry resulting from land use change

What do successful graduates earn?

This on-line continuing education course will take approximately 1 hour to complete. Participants must successfully pass the on-line exam at the end of the course with a score of 70% or higher. If participants pass the exam, a certificate will be set to the e-mail address provided during the registration process.

With a passing grade, 1.5 Continuing Forestry Education (CFE) credits will be earned.
